6 These words that I am commanding you today must always be on your minds. 7 Recite them to your children. Talk about them when you are sitting around your house and when you are out and about, when you are lying down and when you are getting up. Deuteronomy 6:6-7

In a recent conversation, someone asked about how First Christian Church developed our Congregational Care Mission Team. Specifically, they wanted to know about the monthly events the Mission Team plans. The story is special and is something we should truly be proud of.

After we were able to reopen after the COVID shutdown, I thought about a book a seminary professor friend wrote. Rev. Dr. Christopher Rodkey wrote The Synaptic Gospel, a book that looks at how the brain responds to worship. One of the most interesting points was how we need to help developing children learn the meanings of the different parts of worship and what the church does. When engaging the youth, one must find ways to make the church and the worship meaningful to the youth. How do we accomplish this goal? By making the church fun! We teach children frequently through some really fun and exciting activities. I am sure we are all thinking of the wonderful transformation the church goes through for VBS. This is fun!

Now, back to the creation of those amazing Wednesday night activities... After we reopened, I sat down with church leadership and shared some of the ideas from The Synaptic Gospel. We knew the church (and all our world) had experienced heavy trauma during COVID. As we talked, the idea arose to create opportunities for the church to have fun together. As children form special bonds when they play together, we proposed to create a Mission Team that would sponsor intergenerational activities for the church to "play" together. When we look at our Congregational Care Mission Team activities, may we be aware of the healing that is taking place. All of us are healing from the collective trauma of COVID. And when the body of Christ gathers to support one another, we are assured that healing is happening!

So, come one and come all to the wonderful ministries of First Christian! Come to the place where you can see a 3-year-old take the hand of a 98-year-old. Come to the place where we see the resurrected Christ in such fellowship! God is blessing our congregation, and we are so thankful for the friendships and bonds we form here.






Property Mission Team...

Back to Heaven, But His Work Continues

This month we come to the conclusion of this six-part series on the life of Christ as portrayed in the stained glass windows of our church. In the left-side window closest to the chancel, we see Jesus ascending back into heaven. This occurence is talked about in Luke 24 and Acts 1. We also find it mentioned in the Apostles' Creed and yet, it is often skipped over and not thought about. Justin Dillehay at thegospelcoaltion.org says, "It may be the most important doctrine you never think about." The ascension is important for several reasons:

- It explains why Jesus is not physically present on earth today. We know why Paul and Peter aren't here. They died. But, Jesus rose again. He's not here because He ascended.
- 2. It enthrones Jesus. The Bible says that he sat down at the Father's right hand and, by the way, He is interceeding on your behalf to the Father.
- 3.It was essential for Jesus to ascend in order to do something even more valuable than staying here on earth with His followers. He desired to send the Holy Spirit. He Himself said, "It is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper (the Holy Spirit) will not come. But if I go, I will send him to you" (John 16:7)

Among all that the Bible says about Jesus' ascension, perhaps the Angels' question to the disciples is most intriguing. They asked, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." The poor disciples; I think it is obvious why they were looking up. Their friend, their Lord was leaving them. If you will allow me some liberty here, maybe the message was, "While you look up, don't forget to look out." Now, looking up to Jesus is vital in our daily walk. We do this through Bible reading, prayer and worship. However, during Jesus' physical absence, we must not forget to look out and find others who need to hear the message of Jesus and who need our help. Jesus longs to minister to them THROUGH us. What a privilege!





MAY FACTS & EVENTS

Did you know....

- May 3, 1675: A Massachusetts law goes into effect requiring church doors to be locked during services. Officials enacted the law because too many people were leaving before sermons were over.
- Cinco de Mayo (Fifth of May) is not Mexico's national holiday but rather celebrates Mexico's victory over the French at the Battle of Puebla in 1862. Mexican Independence Day is September 16.
- May 17 is Armed Forces Day, which honors those who serve in all branches of the United States military.
- In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson signed a bill designating the second Sunday in May as a legal holiday to be called "Mother's Day"—dedicated "to the best mother in the world, your mother." The original Mother's Day started in West Virginia.
- Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day, was established after the Civil War to honor soldiers who died in service, primarily those who died in the Civil War. It was officially designated by the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) in 1868. The holiday evolved to honor all American military personnel who died in service, regardless of the conflict. It became a federal holiday in 1971.
