





Part 5: The Resurrection

"Tell Me the Story of Jesus" A Six-Part Journey through the Life of Christ as portrayed in the

Stained Glass Windows of First Christian Church of Greenville, North Carolina

Jesus is NOT in this picture!

This month we look at the middle window on the left side. Here we see the greatest event in human history: The Resurrection of Jesus Christ. It's fitting that we come to this window during the month of Easter. The scene is the interior of the tomb. This is the only window in the church where we do not see Jesus at all, but that is exactly as it should be! He is not in the tomb anymore! He is risen! This event is the most important in the Bible and human history. Many people witnessed the evidence of this event. In 1 Corinthians 15, Paul reminds us, "I passed on to you what was most important and what had also been passed on to me. Christ died for our sins, just as the Scriptures said. He was buried, and he was raised from the dead on the third day, just as the Scriptures said. He was seen by Peter and then by the Twelve. After that, he was seen by more than 500 of his followers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. Then he was seen by James and later by all the apostles." Without Christ's resurrection, we would not have victory over sin and death. Later in 1 Corinthians 15, Paul said it like this, "But tell me this—since we preach that Christ rose from the dead, why are some of you saying there will be no resurrection of the dead? For if there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised either. And if Christ has not been raised, then all our preaching is useless, and your faith is useless.....and you are still guilty of your sins. In that case, all who have died believing in Christ are lost! And if our hope in Christ is only for this life, we are more to be pitied than anyone in the world." But Paul triumphantly reminds us, "in fact, Christ has been raised from the dead. He is the first of a great harvest of all who have died......Death is swallowed up in victory. O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?" For sin is the sting that results in death, and the law gives sin its power. But thank God! He gives us victory over sin and death through our Lord Jesus Christ."
